
Berrow Benefice Newsletter 1

Phone Church

The idea behind Phone Church is to enable the community to still come together, worship together and socialise together, even though we can't actually be in the same place at the same time. We have a shortened service, and then there is an opportunity to go round and update everyone with how each person or family is doing, so that we can stay in touch and help each other out. We're doing it through a system called Webex, which means that people can participate either by phoning in or via the internet, depending on what's easiest for them.

The instructions for joining a service by phone are very simple;

Dial in on one of these two numbers:

020 7660 8149

or

020 3478 5289

You will be asked to type in an access code or meeting number using your phone keypad; in both cases the number you need is:

957 933 830

followed by the hash key #

That's all there is to it. If the host (Rev Anthea) is not yet at the meeting you'll probably just hear phone music but once she is online you'll be able to speak to her and all the others who have joined the meeting either online or via phone.

Our next scheduled service is Palm Sunday on Sunday 5th April at 11am, so if you think you might like to join us and can't get hold of a service sheet via the internet, just give Rev Anthea a call on 01684 833 278 and she'll get one posted through your door by someone nearby.

Holy Week Services

All our Holy Week Services will be done via Phone Church this year, but we still aim to go through the whole week following in Jesus footsteps as he walks the way of the Cross towards an agonising death, but then experiences the power and joy of resurrection on Easter Day. Our services are as follows;

Friday 10 th April	2pm	Good Friday Meditation
Sunday 12 th April	11am	Easter Day Service

In addition, Rev Julie intends to do a video service for the 6.30am Sunrise Service, which we'll aim to upload on the website so those who wish to can come together and view that very moving and uplifting start to Easter.

We do hope you will be able to join us for all or any of our Holy Week services.

We are hoping to be able to put Palm Crosses in all our Church porches, so that you have access to these too for Palm Sunday.
