REFLECTION

Jesus often talked to people in different locations. Here he walks by the lake.

So what kind of soil are you?

We know the right answer. Can you claim you're good soil -- producing 30, 60, 100 times what was planted?

Are we the path? Rocky soil? Thorny soil? Or good soil?

Have you ever had to prepare a garden? You know that you have to get our hands in the soil, dig in the dirt, pull up those rocks and root out those thorns. Its hard work but in the fullness of time, we can turn bad soil into good. People have to labour, prepare the soil, root out the bad thorns or rocks to prepare for Jesus to come into our lives fully. What obstacles are in the way?

We have to dig in deep, getting our hands dirty, cut, nicked, pulling up roots and rocks and thorns, so that Jesus' seed can take root and a harvest can follow.

(At home, please read Romans 8:1-11)

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Are we able to cope with being a healthy and sustainable church in this climate of change, streamlining and offering ministry in different and alternative ways?

When seeds fall on the path, they cannot grow for lack of moisture, and the birds come and eat the seed. That's when we fail to understand the word and the implications of being a Kingdom person. As a member of the body of Christ, what ways have we used to open God's word to others?

What about the rocky soil? Jesus says that's a person who receives the word of the kingdom with joy but endures only for a little while and then falls away with any trouble or persecution on account of the word. Do we know people like that?

Discipleship can be hard work. God expects us to bear fruit. And he expects us to bear fruit surrounded by rocks. The more we dig in the soil, the more bruised our hands will be.

The church and within our church community is the place where we bear fruit surrounded by rocks -- our sisters and brothers in Christ -- and where we're rocks to other people.

And we hope that God not only uses us to make Christians out of others but uses others to make Christians out of us -- people who forgive as Jesus commands.

Thorny soil -- Jesus says the thorns in the soil are "the cares of the world and the lure of wealth." They choke the word, so it yields nothing. But have you ever noticed these worries can take over your thinking, your living? Many thorns are wrapped around us, choking us off from being fruitful.

But good fruitful soil can yield an abundance -- 30, 60, 100 times what was sown. I wonder what ministries can achieve those sorts of results? God may throw seeds everywhere. Some of it took root in you and me, or we wouldn't be here. So where can we throw the seed now? Many of our most cherished traditions in history have not helped spread the Gospel.

What wild, unexpected seeds might you be holding in your hands?

Jesus is our role model, if our minds are open to the different possibilities, can we start to attend to the many scattered seeds in alternative ways?

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Jesus met people in different places and in different contexts where they were. We come across all kinds of people who have critical moments in life when something enormously tragic happens to them and they never get over it. To their dying day, they blame God for the tragedy which happened in their life. They also blame God for all the other tragedies that happen in the whole wide world.

There are fair weather Christians who believe in God and are committed to God as long as things are going well. But when things get nasty, they start giving up their faith in God.

The purpose of the Christian faith is not to insulate us from tragedy but to make us strong in the midst of the tragedies of life. The legitimate cares of our lives interfere with the growth of this plant, with the growth of our relationship to Christ. The plant is alive there in that soil but it just doesn't produce any fruit.

And I sense that it is a constant battle in your lives as well.

But then we get to the good soil. It produces a lot. Why? Why is it that some lives are so productive of fruit? Good soil is a miracle where you work hard at the soil. Where you pull out the rocks.

This soil once was filled with rocks and somebody had to dig them out. When you pull out the rocks and when you pull out the weeds. It takes time to age good soil. It takes time of prayer and patience and goodness.

Perhaps we'd all better think about that. I wonder what that means for my life and yours?
