REFLECTION

Paul focuses on the labours of a mother as an image to explain how God is at work in the world. Labours that promise the Kingdom of God coming closer to us and Jesus Christ's promises come closer to fulfilment. Any experience of sheer hard physical and mental work, whether in the job you do, or something that took a lot of effort to achieve, and if you have been through childbirth, you will recognise the force of this analogy.

"I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us," but what has your attention--your present sufferings, today's anxiety, or the promise of something miraculous that will be revealed."

But where is our focus today?

Should we be working harder or seeing better results of our work? Have we laboured very hard?

Is the kingdom of God in our midst?

In our Christian faith, we hear that we are children of God, heirs to eternal life. Do we think about that deeply and with conviction?

Do we feel adopted and part of a loving family? We are very blessed in the way our Berrow Benefice works together and for each other. We pool our gifts and talents and support one another in many different ways. At times, the sheer effort of just maintaining our precious Grade 2* listed buildings may feel like a burden of our labours.

We human beings are spiritual; there is a spiritual component in all human beings throughout the globe, and when Christ's spirit touches our spirit, our spirit comes alive. When the Spirit of Christ is poured into our spirit, when Christ's love is poured into my love, it changes everything about you and me. That spirit has been very much alive and evident over these last few months especially. That aspect of our lives also can cost a great deal of effort and labour to maintain a freshness and desire to continue the journey with God and to seek God's Kingdom on earth.

In Romans reading, our defects of character are considered by Paul. When God's Spirit is alive in us, we are motivated to change those pieces of our personality. We look to the Spirit to motivates us to have "the courage to change the things we can". We hear the prayer, "Grant us the serenity to accept the things we cannot change; the courage to change the

things we can; and the wisdom to know the difference."

We have an inheritance that cannot be destroyed with Jesus Christ, that we can enjoy the security, happiness and hope given to us.

Do you allow the Holy Spirit to guide your decisions?

When the Spirit of God gets inside of you, you become convinced you are a deeply loved child of God and that fans the fires of hope and douses the ashes of doubt and despair. We can get behind those decisions that may be difficult but have widely consulted and carefully considered.

When we are close to God and comfortable in being close with God, we know He knows your name and knows the numbers of hairs in your head. Paul is clear that when we are led by the Spirit of Christ, we *know* we are children of God and therefore we *know* we are God's heirs.

"Provided that we suffer with him and therefore are glorified with him." Genuine love always suffers with and for people in the family. The love of Christ poured into our hearts transforms the kind of love

that we have inside of us and our love now begins to reach out to people in their suffering.

Romans 8:26, The Spirit intercedes deeply for us and teaches us to pray, to converse with God. When you know that you are a child of God, you learn to talk with God as a close friend. We learn how to pray and we learn to talk with God often, just as we would with a close friend.

In the weeks and months ahead, we'll face many challenges. Paul talks as forthrightly as possible about the suffering of humanity and creation as together we await the revealing of what we are in Christ, that is, children of God.

This "eager expectation" Paul refers to in 8:19 is indicates the tension between the two experiences of hope and the state of the world we live in. The state of our faith, our churches, our Diocese and how we feel at this time.

We may have to suffer from knowing what the world could be, even as we live in the world as it is. In Matthews Gospel parable, the field was planted with good seed. It was going to be so beautiful as it grew to maturity, but an enemy sowed weeds among the

wheat, and even as the crop matured, the field was a mess; the crop was threatened, and the workers nearly made things worse by trying to take control of the situation. At the owner's insistence, the field hands endure the wait between weeds appearing and a crop maturing. We often have to keep hold of hope and know that one day things will sort themselves out.

In the parable of the weeds and wheat, we are assured that God will judge all of us one day. How will you and I be judged on what we have achieved?

We don't know what the long-term future holds for anyone. In this present time, with an ageing and declining congregation in the Worcester Diocese, plus the financial challenges, we may have to see more changes than we ever envisaged in the way we structure our churches, our mission in the parishes and our deaneries. In seeking a healthy and sustainable church, many things may have to be transformed and as we journey on as disciples of Jesus Christ, working together as Kingdom People, we may have to be prepared for innovation, and experimentation. Rooted in our faith in God, we step out with hope.

Even so, we people of faith wait with a mixture of eagerness and sheer endurance, we hope for what we do not see. **Amen.**
