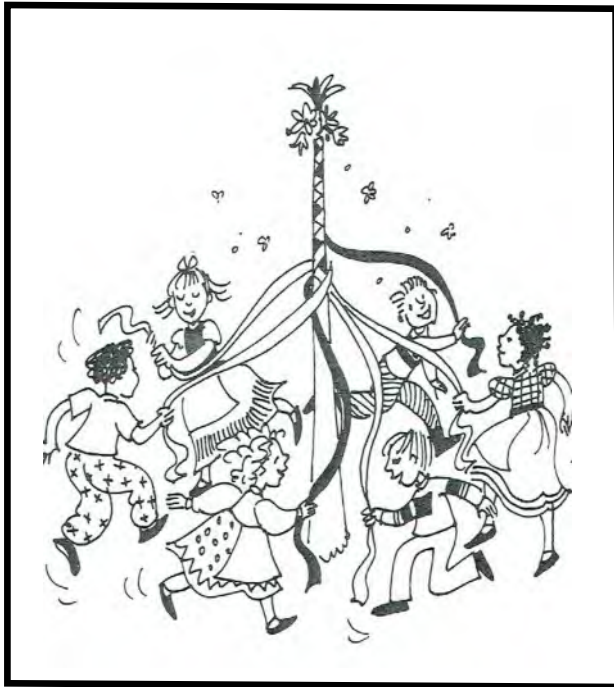

Dear Friends,

Taking a few hours out of the business of parish life, I stepped inside the Beauchamp Community, Newland near Malvern. Members of the laity and clergy of the Malvern and Upton Chapter had gathered for a 'Quiet Day'. The benefactors of this community have encouraged an atmosphere of prayer, hospitality, friendship and care. We completed our time with a service of Holy Communion in St Leonard's Church. Dedicated in 1864. The inside of the church is highly decorated, with icons, biblical scenes, colourful stained-glass windows which can perhaps overpower the senses after a few hours of peace and quiet.

We had been encouraged to listen to the set readings of the lectionary, and to set aside our parish concerns which dominate our days. Instead, just for a few hours, to let our senses be open to the magnificent grounds of the community, maintained mostly by its members. Psalm 55 was poignant for me that day.

'Give ear to my prayer, O God; do not hide yourself from my supplication. Attend to me and answer me; I am troubled in my complaint.'

Wandering across the mowed grass, and past the trickling sound of water in the stone fountain, I was drawn towards the 'wild garden' by the side of a stream. Here blue bells, wild garlic, and the rustle of trees dominate the environment. Away from the telephone, the computer and the challenges of the community, I relaxed on a bench before returning inside. The occasional gust of wind and the damp rain of an April shower was not able to penetrate my warm, weatherproof coat. It was

still hard to set aside completely the long list of tasks yet to complete and those issues still to deal with 'back home'.

Returning to the parishes, I was soon in an encounter with people who took every ounce of patience to listen to and deal with: *'For they bring trouble upon me, and in anger they cherish enmity against me.'* I was grateful for those few moments of sitting in God's creation earlier that day and to remember to 'Cast your burden on the LORD, and he will sustain you; he will never permit the righteous to be moved.'

Here's hoping everyone gets a chance to find their 'chilled space', whether through exercise, music, walking, reading or just 'being'. Taking time out is important for us all and sometimes in our lives, we need to reset our 'buttons', regroup our thoughts in the chaos and demands of our days.

Hopefully, we can also find time for meeting up with family and friends; take a short break, a day out or even go on holiday! Various social events can offer time for fellowship and the more informal church services offer a space to not only refresh our spiritual souls but an occasion of hospitality to meet folk, making networks across our Benefice of parishes. Do check out the local school and church events, we look forward to seeing you. Especially, calling all cake makers/consumers on June 4th!

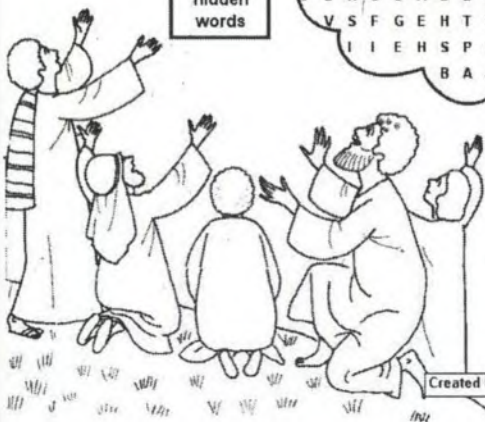

Successful Appeal for Ukraine

Thank you for your generosity

Recipe of the month - May

White fish gratin with asparagus

A light and delightful Spring lunch or supper dish

Ingredients (4 helpings)

4 large or 8 small pieces of white fish (skins removed)
4 medium/large potatoes,
1 bundle (minimum 12 spears) of (English) asparagus
1 pint savoury white sauce
Parmesan shavings
Butter to grease dish
Seasoning
Prawns (optional)

Method

Prepare and parboil potatoes, cool, slice thinly and set aside. Make 1 pint savoury white sauce (use fish stock/vegetable stock cube to flavour). Wash the skinless fish fillets, check for and remove any bones. Butter a flat oven-proof dish. Lay the fish over the bottom. Season lightly. Cover with half the sauce and overlay the thinly sliced potatoes, then add the remaining sauce. Finally, spread the trimmed, washed asparagus spears evenly over the top, allowing 3-4 per serving. Season. (Optional; at this stage, place a few prawns evenly over the top) Cover with a thin layer of parmesan shavings. Bake in a moderate/hot oven for about 25 mins, until the potatoes and asparagus are cooked through.

Serve with crusty bread and green vegetables or a green salad.

It already has been quite a year at Eldersfield Lawn CE Primary school. We started the academic year with the news that we had been nominated for and won the Outstanding Progress (Primary) in the Education Business Awards and are going to complete this year with another celebration.

Originally opened in 1871 this year is the sesquicentennial (150th) anniversary of Eldersfield Lawn Primary. Although the school has changed in many ways since it was opened, including amalgamating with Tirley and Eldersfield primary schools when they closed, community and family are still central to the role we have as a rural school.

We are excited and delighted to invite the local community along to our celebration event on Saturday 18th June. We will be holding a traditional summer fayre from 2-4pm and then go straight into a ceilidh with hog roast from 4-7pm. This event will see the launch of the school's oral history project, where we are hoping to emulate our original Victorian logbooks with memories from previous and current pupils.

We are really hoping that many of our current and previous pupils and their families would like to join us for this event and take part in some way; whether sharing a memory or two in our exhibition, having a stall or just joining us for some celebration fun and afternoon tea.

If you would like to join us for the ceilidh we would recommend you book a ticket in advance by contacting the school office after May 1st. Tickets cost £15 for a family consisting of up to 2 adults and 4 children. There will be a hog roast and bar available for keeping the energy levels up.

We are really proud of what our students and school have achieved over the last few difficult years and look forward to catching up with families who have moved on, to find out what is being achieved by past pupils in their lives today.

Castlemorton Environmental Action Group (CEAG)



CEAG held the **launch meeting** of the group on 24 March. Mike Wilkinson did a presentation titled '**Castlemorton and Environmental Sustainability**' which led to a discussion of areas of interest from the audience and suggested topics for talks and areas to focus on (including biodiversity, reducing food and plastic waste, encouraging young people to become involved, raising awareness, solar heating and home insulation).

Following on from this a meeting is planned for 26 April at Castlemorton Village Hall at 7pm to develop a **programme of talks and activities**.

A **web page** is now available on **Castlemorton Hub** (<http://castlemorton.org.uk/>), which provides details of forthcoming meetings and events, articles and the presentation by Mike.

Plastic free products stall – this was held at the **community café** on April 8th and will be run at the monthly future community café events (next café May 13th). Ideas for other stalls on an environmental theme are welcomed.

Community fridge – there is a community fridge in Upton based at Upton Baptist Church, Old Street. Free for anyone to use to either donate food or collect food. See full article describing how this works.

These were advertised via Facebook and people invited to come to the community café on 8 April to collect them. Thanks to everyone who rehomed trees. It is anticipated that we will be offered further trees in the Autumn.

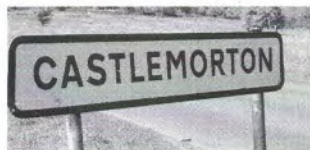
Rogation Sunday is on 22nd May 2022

Baptism (or Christening)

The baptism service is for a child or adult. As an adult, you make the decision and the promises. A child has adults (godparents) who make decisions and promises on behalf of a child.

At the point you are baptized, you simply have water poured on your head. If you are considering being baptized or for a member of your family, do talk to us as we will be delighted to help. Baptism can occur during the usual church services which rotate around the Benefice or at a time for just you, your family and friends.

Funerals

If you wish to have a church service, please contact the priest to check dates as soon as possible. With your chosen Funeral Director, all bookings and other arrangements can proceed for you, the family and with the help and support of the clergy during this difficult time. We are still requesting the wearing of face coverings inside the buildings.

If you wish to have a burial in the churchyards at St John's, Eldersfield. St Faith's, Berrow or All Saints, Hollybush, the deceased person must have been resident in that Parish. Reservations (which last for 25 years) can be made by applying for a faculty which is a formal legal process and which we can help guide you through.

The Diocese of Worcester has issued guidelines for the erection of memorials in the churchyard. Please contact a local Stonemason who will have these details.



Weddings during Coronavirus-rules are being updated. Please check the website. www.berrowbenefice.org.uk

Many wedding days have sadly been disrupted by Coronavirus restrictions. **At present, we are holding church services each Sunday. Please check for details on the website or contact us to check.** For the 'qualifying attendance' to be married in a church, you need to attend for 6 months, once a month. Numbers attending are increasing-but we still ask guests to wear masks in church, as singing is now allowed.

How we get you legally wed

We are legally entitled to marry you in a Church of England church through the publication of banns, read 3 times before the wedding date. We ask you to contact your local parish church and arrange when the banns are to be read 3 times there too. A **Marriage Document** is now signed at the church ceremony since the rules changed on May 4th 2021 and then you apply for a Marriage Licence through the **Worcester Registry Office**. We will give you all the details.

Common License

If you have made the qualifying connection to the Church, you can apply for a Common License to marry with us. We have already explained to our couples who could apply for this and what is involved.

Civil Ceremony followed by a Blessing in Church

In the interim, if a Registrar marriage is possible, you could have a civil ceremony. We can offer you a Church blessing of your marriage which is as similar to a full wedding as we can make it.

Conclusion

Rev'd Anthea and I are ready to help you during this decision making process. Please do discuss the options with us and your wedding venue hosts. It is an anxious and frustrating time and no-one can predict too far in the future what restrictions, rules or recommendations will be made.

Be safe and keep healthy! May your love for one another be strengthened and bind you closer than ever during this upheaval worldwide.
