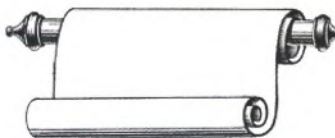
POPPIES IN 2022

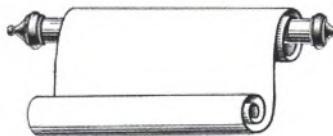

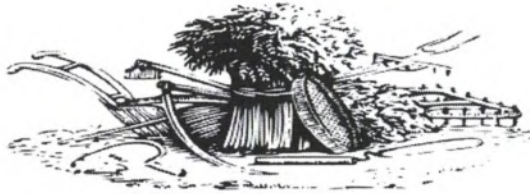

Recipe of the month – September

Ruth's Ginger Cake

Roy Pritchard has, very kindly, allowed me to use this recipe, which was so much enjoyed, as the "Recipe of the Month". Thank you, Roy; and thank you, Ruth, for the many delicious ginger cakes you made.

Ingredients

8 oz plain flour (+ a pinch of salt)
3 teaspoons ground ginger
2 level teaspoons bicarb
¼ pint milk
4 oz margarine
4 oz soft, dark, brown sugar
4 tablespoons golden syrup
2 beaten eggs

Method

Line a 6 – 7 inch round tin (with loose bottom). Sieve the flour, bicarb and ginger. Beat the margarine until soft and creamy. Add milk, sugar, syrup and beaten eggs, then mix into the flour, bicarb and ginger. This should give a soft mix. Pour into lined tin. Bake for about 1½ hours in a moderate oven until firm and dark brown. Allow to cool before serving.

You could save a life! - DEFIBRILLATORS

Did you know that Berrow and Pendock are fortunate to have **THREE AED (Automated Electronic Defibrillators)** available locally?

These require **no training to use BUT** are the best way to save someone's life if they have gone into cardiac arrest – and time is of the essence.

The Defibrillators locally are found at:

- **Outside Ellis Dawe and Son LTD Timber Supply Merchant at the Junction of A438/Rye Street (Opposite the Duke of York Pub)**
- **In Hollybush on the A438 towards Ledbury near to the Hollybush Car Park for the Malvern Hills**
- **Pendock Village shop on the wall outside**

The Defibrillators are locked in a cabinet with a yellow case. There is a coded lock and a 999 call handler will give you the code to open the cabinet and access the defibrillator.

If you think that someone has had a cardiac arrest (they are not obviously breathing or responding to you) you should:

- 1) Dial 999 and shout for help
- 2) Start doing CPR – the 999 operator will talk you through this, you DON'T need to breathe into anyone's mouth, just do chest compressions.
- 3) Send someone to get a defibrillator if you can. These do not need any specialist training to use. They talk you through how to use them and will only deliver a shock if the onboard computer thinks it's appropriate. You don't need to make any decisions.

Services were always prepared and no matter who the incumbent everyone got a smile and warm welcome. Gwyneth just got on with the job without fuss.

Gwyneth was a teacher in History and English. She married Les and they had three children; Jenny, Michael and Richard. Les was a mathematician so they were a well-matched pair. She taught at St. Mary's Convent, Worcester, Abbey Girls School in Malvern Wells, The Chase High School and finally ending her career at The Hill School in Upton. They and the family moved to Portway Cottage, Pendock. She became a Governor and later Chair of Governors at Pendock Primary School and very much looked forward to helping children with reading. Sadly Les passed away in 2002 leaving Gwyneth bereft.

She had a fair menagerie of animals who needed and enjoyed her love and attention; ponies, a donkey, many dogs and cats, chickens and cockerels, and together with the wonderful grandchildren they all wanted her attention and getting it. Needless to say her chosen charity was 'The Blue Cross'.

VACANCY – TREASURER / SECRETARY

A vacancy has arisen for the role of Treasurer/ Secretary of Berrow and Pendock Village Hall.

- Managing the village hall bank accounts and arranging for invoices to be paid when due.
- Keeping up to date accounts and producing an end of year financial statement for approval by the committee.
- Arranging committee meetings and the AGM (4 meetings per year).
- Producing agendas and minutes for the meetings.
- Acting as a liaison point to the committee as necessary.

No previous experience is necessary, but admin/finance background would be advantageous along with good IT skills. An ability to work on their own initiative also desirable.

Most people only visualise a priest working on a Sunday. The reality is that preparing for Sunday services, Bible Study, and daily prayers are only a small part of my role. Looking after several churches, being on many different committees including being a school governor for our two local schools, engaging in a large wedding ministry, plus occasional offices like funerals and baptisms, means that my working week is very busy.

The Pastoral Visitor is Mrs Cathy Powell-Chandler. Part of her role is to co-ordinate pastoral visitors within our church communities. If you would specifically like me to visit you, then please indicate this by contacting me direct or via one of the church officers, all details of which are in the magazine. In a caring community, we all look to see whether our neighbours need or wish to accept our help.

Weddings-Please check the website. www.berrowbenefice.org.uk

Many wedding days have sadly been disrupted by Coronavirus restrictions. **At present, we are holding church services each Sunday. Please check for details on the website or contact us to check.** For the 'qualifying attendance' to be married in a church, you need to attend for 6 months, once a month. Numbers attending are increasing-but we still ask guests to wear masks in church, as singing is now allowed.

How we get you legally wed

We are legally entitled to marry you in a Church of England church through the publication of banns, read 3 times before the wedding date. We ask you to contact your local parish church and arrange when the banns are to be read 3 times there too. A **Marriage Document** is now signed at the church ceremony since the rules changed on May 4th 2021 and then you apply for a Marriage Licence through the **Worcester Registry Office**. We will give you all the details.

Common License

If you have made the qualifying connection to the Church, you can apply for a Common License to marry with us. We have already explained to our couples who could apply for this and what is involved.

Civil Ceremony followed by a Blessing in Church

In the interim, if a Registrar marriage is possible, you could have a civil ceremony. We can offer you a Church blessing of your marriage which is as similar to a full wedding as we can make it.

Conclusion

Rev'd Anthea and I are ready to help you during this decision making process. Please do discuss the options with us and your wedding venue hosts. It is an anxious and frustrating time and no-one can predict too far in the future what restrictions, rules or recommendations will be made.
