Dear Friends,

The weather is certainly broadcasting that Autumn has arrived, with the odd bonus of some lovely sunny afternoons. The apple harvest is expected to be abundant, but how abundant are our hopes and expectations for our families, our community and the world in general? We are constantly aware of the anxious state of our world, our climate and the economy through the different media channels of communication. As we all struggle to deal with rising costs, buying food, heating and cooking, difficult choices are being made in many households.

As we approach November 11th, we are asked to remember both military and civilian folk who have been instrumental in defending and protecting our nations, our freedoms and our way of life. It is the 40th anniversary of the Falklands Conflict, the 78th of D-Day. We can anchor ourselves in different ways and I offer this quote.

May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and by his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope, encourage your hearts and strengthen you in every good deed and word. 2 Thessalonians 2:16-17.

Recipe of the month - November

Autumn Bake

A few crisp and cold autumn days leaves a desire for warming and more filling meals. This "bake"/casserole is just the thing to use lots of vegies and whatever meat you have to hand. It does need onion or leek to give some depth to the flavour but otherwise, anything goes!

Ingredients (selection)

1 leek, 1 onion 1 carrot, 1 parsnip Celery Several mushrooms Tomatoes Sweetcorn Peppers Courgette etc 2-3 rashers streaky bacon (Garlic) 1 tablespoon oil Good pinch of herbs, seasoning Enough good stock to moisten well Meat – either leftovers chopped up or precooked chicken, pork fillet, sausage, chorizo. Any or all? Potato slices (precooked but not overcooked) Grated cheese

Method

Prepare and chop up all the veg, meat etc. Parcook and slice potatoes. In a large frying pan, start with chopped bacon and oil. Add onion/leek and other root veg little by little, stirring continually. Transfer into a deep casserole dish. Add other veg, courgette rings, chopped tomatoes etc. Season, including herbs. Stir in "cubes" of meat and just cover with good stock. Then sliced potatoes and, finally, grated cheese. Bake in a moderate oven until all cooked through thoroughly and the cheese is golden.

It's an all-in-one dish; nothing else needed!



At present, we are holding church two church services each Sunday. Please check for details on the website or contact us. For the 'qualifying attendance' to be married in a church, you need to attend for 6 months, once a month.

How we get you legally wed

We are legally entitled to marry you in a Church of England church through the publication of banns, read 3 times before the wedding date. We ask you to contact your local parish church and arrange when the banns are to be read 3 times there too. A **Marriage Document** is now signed at the church ceremony since the rules changed on May 4th 2021 and then you apply for a Marriage Licence through the **Worcester Registry Office**. We will give you all the details.

Common License

In very special cases, you can apply for a Common License to marry with us. Please do seek an early explanation and the process involved.

Civil Ceremony followed by a Blessing in Church

If you are unable to attend for 6 months to qualify, then you could have Registrar a civil ceremony first. We can then offer you a Church blessing of your marriage which is as similar to a full wedding as we can make it.

Conclusion

Rev'd Anthea and I are ready to help you during this decision making process. Please do discuss the options with us and your wedding venue hosts. We do try to meet your expectations and make this a special day. Do try and attend our marriage preparation day. We try to answer your questions, look at the wedding day itself and looking ahead to the future.

Be safe and keep healthy! May your love for one another be strengthened and bind you closer than ever during the challenges of our world.

Baptism (or Christening)

The baptism service is for a child or adult. As an adult, you make the decision and the promises. A child has adults (godparents) who make decisions and promises on behalf of a child.

At the point you are baptized, you simply have water poured on your head. If you are considering being baptized or for a member of your family, do talk to us as we will be delighted to help. Baptism can occur during the usual church services which rotate around the Benefice or at a time for just you, your family and friends.

Funerals

If you wish to have a church service, please contact the priest to check dates as soon as possible. With your chosen Funeral Director, all bookings and other arrangements can proceed for you, the family and with the help and support of the clergy during this difficult time. We are still requesting the wearing of face coverings inside the buildings.

If you wish to have a burial in the churchyards at St John's, Eldersfield. St Faith's, Berrow or All Saints, Hollybush, the deceased person must have been resident in that Parish. Reservations (which last for 25 years) can be made by applying for a faculty which is a formal legal process and which we can help guide you through.

The Diocese of Worcester has issued guidelines for the erection of memorials in the churchyard. Please contact a local Stonemason who will have these details.



Pastoral care is one aspect of a priest's role. The word *pastor* comes from the Latin word for "shepherd." Caring for a person who is struggling with a difficulty, being present during a time of pain, praying with someone in a crisis—these are the moments when we need to know someone can come alongside us from the church community.

Most people only visualise a priest working on a Sunday. The reality is that preparing for Sunday services, Bible Study, and daily prayers are only a small part of my role. Looking after several churches, being on many different committees including being a school governor for our two local schools, engaging in a large wedding ministry, plus occasional offices like funerals and baptisms, means that my working week is very busy.

The Pastoral Visitor is Mrs Cathy Powell-Chandler. Part of her role is to co-ordinate pastoral visitors within our church communities. If you would specifically like me to visit you, then please indicate this by contacting me direct or via one of the church officers, all details of which are in the magazine. In a caring community, we all look to see whether our neighbours need or wish to accept our help.

Praying the Psalms by the Bishop of Dudley, Martin Gorick

I love the psalms. We use them every day in Morning and Evening Prayer and I know many people have been meeting together on Zoom for these short services, or joining services from churches and cathedrals streamed online since the first Covid lockdown. If you haven't discovered them yet, have a word with your parish priest to see whether there is a daily morning prayer group in your local church that you could join, or perhaps one online.

These set prayers are called the Daily Office and have been part of the rhythm and pattern of Anglican life for centuries. If you can't get to one in your church, but have a smartphone or computer, look for the Daily Prayer App from the Church of England. It will give you the readings and psalms set for each day, and even has an audio version if you want to join in with others or listen with headphones.

Most days there is a verse that stands out for me. Today it was a verse from Psalm 85:

Mercy and truth are met together: righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

Sometimes we can be so concerned for God's truth, that we can forget God's mercy. Or we can be so keen to keep the peace that we forget God's desire for justice. As the cost-of-living crisis bites ever deeper this winter we need to hold this divine balance. In the 'gated streets of trickle down' there will be no real peace without God's righteousness.

Earlier this year, the Revd Catherine Lack was elected as chair of the group. She said: "The work of the forum is all about education, not conversion. In today's world, it's so important as we all work with people of different faiths, as well as those without faith. Even if we don't all believe the same thing, we can and must work together to improve our society."

Worcestershire Interfaith Forum runs events and Catherine has led a series of 'Scriptural Reasoning' meetings in which members of different faiths look at pieces of scripture and discuss the similarities and differences between them. The group is also keen to offer training on religious diversity to businesses and others, raising awareness of different faiths and encouraging people to talk to those with different beliefs.

"I am also very willing to visit parishes to preach around this theme or to facilitate small discussion groups. All religions preach peace and the more we respect and understand each other, the better our world will be." said Catherine.




