Dear Friends,
In our lives, we are used to having a choice. Walk into a large supermarket and the choice seems mind boggling at times. Circumstances can limit those choices, as the time during lock down due to Covid brought into stark reality for our world. Choices can become less in our lives due to many factors: economic, health, mobility to name but a few. We don't like pain or change, and humans try and avoid it.

Out of sadness, regret, depression, disappointment, we may expect the worst but we are the children of God. While we encounter our world, we must not do so pessimistically; but while trusting that all pain and discomfort are like birth pains--all groans lead the way to a new life.

I hope and pray that we all continue to support and collaborate with one another. With openness, encouragement and having the strength to put our faith in God into practice, we step forward into the future and embrace the possibilities and changes that are inevitable.

## Elections!

All the councillors who currently comprise the Parish Council are required by law to retire in May - only a few weeks away - and new elections will be held. There is, of course, nothing to prevent them standing again but even if they all do (and I cannot know whether they will or will not) that would leave the Council with three unfilled positions. There are nine seats on the Council and today we have only six councillors. We need volunteers!

So what do Councillors do? You will certainly have seen the new gates at the entry to Corse Lawn. You will have seen the drop-off area for children by the school, and you should know that at the school there is a defibrillator available for public use. These are all initiative undertaken or promoted by the Parish Council.

Councillors contribute in less visible ways. When an application is made to Malvern Hills District Council for planning permission - to add an extension, or convert a barn, for example - they ask us what we think. They are required to do this by law, but they also value our opinion, because we have local knowledge which they do not. And Councillors are the people who decide what advice to give.

Have you ever thought that you would like to contribute to our community? Are you new to the area and would like to meet people? Being a councillor lets you do both, Perhaps you have been a resident for a long time: you know what needs improving; why not help bring about the changes you know are needed?

If you have any questions, do please contact any Councillor (their contact details can be found on the web - just google "Eldersfield Parish Council" and click on "Parish Councillors" - or contact me.

If you want to go ahead, you will need a nomination pack, and these can be obtained from Katie.Vass@malvernhills.gov.uk or from me. Note that they must be submitted (by hand) to the Returning Officer at Malvern Hills District Council on any working day between Monday 20 March 2023 and Tuesday 4 April 2023.

## Recipe of the month - March

## Smoked Haddock Crumble with a Creamy Chive Sauce

## Ingredients (for 3-4 helpings)

12 oz smoked haddock (proper smoked haddock!)
(Optional: a few prawns)
$3 / 4$ pint milk
$11 / 2$ oz butter
$11 / 2$ oz flour (cornflour if the dish is to be frozen)
1 - 2 tablespoons single cream
Seasoning
Chopped chives (to taste)
For the topping
4 oz white breadcrumbs
2 oz butter
Pinch of mixed herbs and chives

## Method

Prepare the topping by rubbing in the butter to "fine crumb" and adding the seasoning and herbs. Set aside.

Poach the haddock in the milk. Drain and retain the milk. Cool and flake the fish, removing any bones and the skin. Set aside. In a clean pan, melt the butter, then add the flour to make a roux. Gradually add milk to make a smooth sauce. Finish with cream, adjust the seasoning and add the chopped chives and fish (and prawns). Put into a greased ovenproof dish. Cool, then add topping. Bake in a moderate oven for 20-25 minutes until golden.

Serving suggestion: serve with spinach and creamed potato.

At present, we are holding a rotation of services each Sunday. Please check for details on the website or contact us. For the 'qualifying attendance' to be married in a church, you need to attend for a minimum of 6 months, once a month.

## How we get you legally wed

We are legally entitled to marry you in a Church of England church through the publication of banns, read 3 times before the wedding date. We ask you to contact your local parish church and arrange when the banns are to be read 3 times there too. A Marriage Document is now signed at the church ceremony since the rules changed on May $4^{\text {th }} 2021$ and then you apply for a Marriage Licence through the Worcester Registry Office. We will give you all the details.

## Common License

In very special cases, you can apply for a Common License to marry with us. Please do seek an early explanation and the process involved.

## Civil Ceremony followed by a Blessing in Church

If you are unable to attend for 6 months to qualify, then you could have Registrar a civil ceremony first. We can then offer you a Church blessing of your marriage which is as similar to a full wedding as we can make it.

## Conclusion

Rev'd Anthea and I are ready to help you during this decision making process. Please do discuss the options with us and your wedding venue hosts. We do try to meet your expectations and make this a special day. Do try and attend our marriage preparation day. We try to answer your questions, look at the wedding day itself and looking ahead to the future.

Be safe and keep healthy! May your love for one another be strengthened and bind you closer than ever during the challenges of our world.

## Baptism (or Christening)

The baptism service is for a child or adult. As an adult, you make the decision and the promises. A child has adults (godparents) who make decisions and promises on behalf of a child.

At the point you are baptized, you simply have water poured on your head. If you are considering being baptized or for a member of your family, do talk to us as we will be delighted to help. Baptism can occur during the usual church services which rotate around the Benefice or at a time for just you, your family and friends.

## Funerals

If you wish to have a church service, please contact the priest to check dates as soon as possible. With your chosen Funeral Director, all bookings and other arrangements can proceed for you, the family and with the help and support of the clergy during this difficult time. We are still requesting the wearing of face coverings inside the buildings.

If you wish to have a burial in the churchyards at St John's, Eldersfield. St Faith's, Berrow or All Saints, Hollybush, the deceased person must have been resident in that Parish. Reservations (which last for 25 years) can be made by applying for a faculty which is a formal legal process and which we can help guide you through.

The Diocese of Worcester has issued guidelines for the erection of memorials in the churchyard. Please contact a local Stonemason who will have these details.

## pastoral care

Pastoral care is one aspect of a priest's role. The word pastor comes from the Latin word for "shepherd." Caring for a person who is struggling with a difficulty, being present during a time of pain, praying with someone in a crisis-these are the moments when we need to know someone can come alongside us from the church community.

Most people only visualise a priest working on a Sunday. The reality is that preparing for Sunday services, Bible Study, and daily prayers are only a small part of my role. Looking after several churches, being on many different committees including being a school governor for our two local schools, engaging in a large wedding ministry, plus occasional offices like funerals and baptisms, means that my working week is very busy.

The Pastoral Visitor is Mrs Cathy Powell-Chandler. Part of her role is to co-ordinate pastoral visitors within our church communities. If you would specifically like me to visit you, then please indicate this by contacting me direct or via one of the church officers, all details of which are in the magazine. In a caring community, we all look to see whether our neighbours need or wish to accept our help.
