As we celebrate Easter, may you have much joy and happiness; to be as sweet as those chocolate eggs. Wishing you a blessed and happy Easter.

Church of England Confirmation

We are offering some preparation time for some youngsters in the Benefice for a Confirmation service to be held probably at St John the Baptist, Eldersfield, at a date yet to be booked with a Bishop presiding.

Confirmation is a special church service in which a person confirms the promises that were made when they were baptized. If you were baptized at a christening when you were a child, your parents and godparents made these promises on your behalf.

Confirmation consists of the renewal of baptismal promises and the laying on of hands and anointing with the oil of Chrism by a Bishop. You can also be baptized and confirmed in this service. After confirmation, you are then encouraged to attend church and partake in receiving the bread and wine at a Communion Service.

At confirmation, there are no godparents because you make your own promises, but you would probably be asked for a sponsor to stand with you as a supporting friend in your journey of faith.

Walking Church – Sunday 30th April

You may have noticed a new item on the timetable of Sunday services on the back of this edition of the Parish Magazine. We have a fifth Sunday at the end of this month, a chance to try out something a little different, something not in the usual pattern of services and this fifth Sunday I've opted for Walking Church.

What is Walking Church you may be asking? Me too. From the research I have done it is different in each and every place it happens — which makes sense because everyone will have a different environment in which to walk. My interpretation is that walking church is taking church out into our community, and is inspired by the experience of standing in the middle of a housing estate in Redditch, praying for that community. So I am proposing that as we walk, we pause from time to time to hear the bible readings set for the day and to pray for the community surrounding us. I'm aiming to begin with the community around Pendock Cross and St Faith's Berrow, and, if people enjoy the experience, extend to our other churches and communities.

I am aware that walking for between 30 and 45 minutes isn't possible for all, so on arrival at St Faith's at 11am there will be a short communion service for those unable to be part of the walking bit of Walking Church. And if, as we are in glorious England, the weather should turn inclement, we will walk, talk and pray around St Faiths!

Recipe of the month - April

Easter Bavarois

A light dessert; would be suitable to follow a roast main course. Taking a basic vanilla Bavarois, it is given an Easter finish.

Ingredients (for 3 - 4 helpings)

1 pint milk
Vanilla essence
4 large eggs separated into yolks and whites
3 - 4 oz castor sugar
½ pint double/whipping cream
Gelatine – 1 leaf or powder to set 1 pint
Fruit purée (apricot, peach or mango, not too runny)

Method

If using leaf gelatine, first soak in cold water to soften, then squeeze out water. Heat milk and vanilla essence and add softened gelatine or gelatine powder; dissolve thoroughly, making sure that there are no lumps of gelatine. Beat egg yolks and sugar to a thick cream consistency, then beat in the gelatine thickened milk and allow to cool. Separately, beat the cream to a thick custard consistency. With a clean whisk, beat the egg whites to stiffen. Gently combine all three, yolks, whites and cream. Prepare a mould or dish(es) by rinsing with cold water and covering the bottom with a generous helping of fruit purée. Then spoon over vanilla bavarois and place in fridge to set. Before serving, decorate with mini chocolate Easter eggs. If set in large mould, ease away from edge and turn out into a dish, allowing the purée to run down, then decorate with chocolate eggs.

Note

The bavarois recipe is a basic classic and can be adapted with different flavours, e.g.,

- 1. coffee (+ liqueur sauce such as Tia Maria)
- 2. raspberry coulis and fresh raspberries
- 3. rhubarb compote to accompany
- 4. lemon/lemon curd






