#### Dear Friends.

The Easter Sunrise service is always special at Pendock Old Church, with the rays of the sun filtered through the lovely stained glass window behind the altar. It took 15 hours by Volunteers to ready and clean the inside of this medieval redundant church, part of the Churches Trust organisation, which looks to us to maintain it still. Alleluia, Christ is risen! We gave the acclamation as the five Pascal candles of our Benefice, one for each church, were lit for the first time.

Reflecting on the empty tomb and resurrection of Jesus after the 40 days of Lenten preparation, was a great joy. Easter eggs, Easter egg hunts, and chocolates consumed, followed by different Easter activities at Eldersfield continued our Easter celebrations after the very well attended Holy Communion service at St Faith, Berrow.

With the weather giving us a great variety, the cycle of life continues with the emergence of greenery and blossom in the hedges, woods and in our gardens. As the daffodils fade, other flora and fauna appear and spring lambs, piglets, calves and other baby animals and birds can be found.

In the cycle of the church liturgy, in Acts 2, there is much to learn about the story of the Day of Pentecost. The people gathered at that time from all over the world: different nationalities, cultures and dialects. Peter and the other disciples spoke of the Day of Pentecost for the rest of their lives. It changed the way they thought, felt and acted. They had only watched Jesus do things, but now they went on His behalf to proclaim to the world what He had done.

And this is what happens to believers today! Many people misunderstand Pentecost and the power of the Holy Spirit. Many people experience and understand the power of the Holy Spirit in different ways, depending on their personality, their life experiences and their own faith journey. People are challenged or can remain unconvinced. In Romans 8:16 tells us that –"The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God. Jesus gave to us the model", or the example for us in John 14:16, "And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever."

Each of the disciples needed the Holy Spirit to give them the strength and wisdom to carry on the work Jesus started for the emerging Christian church; for they were just ordinary people. People of faith today are just ordinary people and face a challenging world, where exploring faith or even going to church is not part of many people's lifestyle. Christians today also need the Holy Spirit to help us transform ourselves, our actions and to help us to be part of the work building up of the Christian life from Jesus's model. We look for guidance of the Holy Spirit in these times of much change in our world and in our church communities. As we open our hearts to God's purpose, may our churches welcome all people and be places of love, joy , peace and justice.

#### Recipe of the month - May

#### **Rissotto**

The best rice to use is Italian ARBORIO (this dish is, after all, Italian!) and, if possible, avoid long grain rice. Arborio rice has a high starch content, which it releases to help give a creamy finish to the dish. Use rice to stock in the proportion of approximately 1:4.

#### Ingredients (for 3 - 4 helpings)

1 tea cupful rice

1 pint (approx.) good chicken or veg stock

1 medium onion, finely chopped

2 - 3 oz butter

1 teaspoon oil

2 – 3 oz grated parmesan cheese

Seasoning

together with any or all of the following options:

1 small glass dry white wine

1 clove garlic, finely chopped

1 stick celery, finely chopped

Spring onion, finely chopped

Parsley, finely chopped

#### <u>Method</u>

This recipe needs 20 minutes of constant stirring and attention, then 5 minutes rest before serving. Take a large non-stick frying pan (with lid). Heat the stock separately so as to use it <u>hot</u> when adding to the rice. Using most of the butter and the oil, gently sauté the onion (+ the garlic and celery if selected) until soft, but do not allow to take colour. Stir in the rice and coat until translucent. If using wine, add at this stage. Then start

adding the hot stock, a ladleful at a time, stirring constantly until absorbed; then add another ladleful etc. After about 18 – 20 minutes the result should be thick and creamy. Test to make sure the rice has become 'al dente' but cooked through, then add spring onion, parsley and milled black pepper. Stir in half the parmesan cheese and the remaining butter. Put the lid on the pan and turn the heat off. Allow the cheese to melt into the rice before making additions and serving. Offer extra grated cheese.

#### Suggested additions

- 1. Diced, cooked chicken breast and sliced chestnut mushrooms.
- Cooked peeled prawns.
- 3. Cooked asparagus tips and peas and/or baby broad beans.
- 4. Chopped ham and tomato concassé (no seeds or peel)

At present, we are holding a rotation of services each Sunday. Please check for details on the website or contact us. For the 'qualifying attendance' to be married in a church, you need to attend for a minimum of 6 months, once a month.

#### How we get you legally wed

We are legally entitled to marry you in a Church of England church through the publication of banns, read 3 times before the wedding date. We ask you to contact your local parish church and arrange when the banns are to be read 3 times there too. A **Marriage Document** is now signed at the church ceremony since the rules changed on May 4<sup>th</sup> 2021 and then you apply for a Marriage Licence through the **Worcester Registry Office**. We will give you all the details.

#### **Common License**

In very special cases, you can apply for a Common License to marry with us. Please do seek an early explanation and the process involved.

#### Civil Ceremony followed by a Blessing in Church

If you are unable to attend for 6 months to qualify, then you could have Registrar a civil ceremony first. We can then offer you a Church blessing of your marriage which is as similar to a full wedding as we can make it.

#### **Conclusion**

Rev'd Anthea and I are ready to help you during this decision making process. Please do discuss the options with us and your wedding venue hosts. We do try to meet your expectations and make this a special day. Do try and attend our marriage preparation day. We try to answer your questions, look at the wedding day itself and looking ahead to the future.

Be safe and keep healthy! May your love for one another be strengthened and bind you closer than ever during the challenges of our world.

#### **Baptism (or Christening)**

The baptism service is for a child or adult. As an adult, you make the decision and the promises. A child has adults (godparents) who make decisions and promises on behalf of a child.

At the point you are baptized, you simply have water poured on your head. If you are considering being baptized or for a member of your family, do talk to us as we will be delighted to help. Baptism can occur during the usual church services which rotate around the Benefice or at a time for just you, your family and friends.

#### **Funerals**

If you wish to have a church service, please contact the priest to check dates as soon as possible. With your chosen Funeral Director, all bookings and other arrangements can proceed for you, the family and with the help and support of the clergy during this difficult time. We are still requesting the wearing of face coverings inside the buildings.

If you wish to have a burial in the churchyards at St John's, Eldersfield. St Faith's, Berrow or All Saints, Hollybush, the deceased person must have been resident in that Parish. Reservations (which last for 25 years) can be made by applying for a faculty which is a formal legal process and which we can help guide you through.

The Diocese of Worcester has issued guidelines for the erection of memorials in the churchyard. Please contact a local Stonemason who will have these details.



Pastoral care is one aspect of a priest's role. The word *pastor* comes from the Latin word for "shepherd." Caring for a person who is struggling with a difficulty, being present during a time of pain, praying with someone in a crisis—these are the moments when we need to know someone can come alongside us from the church community.

Most people only visualise a priest working on a Sunday. The reality is that preparing for Sunday services, Bible Study, and daily prayers are only a small part of my role. Looking after several churches, being on many different committees including being a school governor for our two local schools, engaging in a large wedding ministry, plus occasional offices like funerals and baptisms, means that my working week is very busy.

The Pastoral Visitor is Mrs Cathy Powell-Chandler. Part of her role is to co-ordinate pastoral visitors within our church communities. If you would specifically like me to visit you, then please indicate this by contacting me direct or via one of the church officers, all details of which are in the magazine. In a caring community, we all look to see whether our neighbours need or wish to accept our help.






