# Dear Friends,

The changes in the pastoral organisation of the Church of England over the past decades have resulted in a sharp reduction in the number of rural clergy, and the amalgamation of churches within multi-parish benefices. Without a resident priest, how can we create those critical networks within the community and extend the contact with the church beyond the usual congregation. How do we prepare for the future?

There are multiple large churches across our land. Malvern churches talk about 300 in their congregations. Yet religious surveys show that the number of people who identify themselves as Christians is on the decline while irreligion atheism, agnosticism, secular humanism — is on the rise.

Young people are growing up in a world that is increasingly insistent in telling them through the social media what they should believe. But how do we learn and decide for ourselves? Many young people, as well as adults, are seeking answers that are a bit bigger than the world around them. Where do they search for those answers?

Families who were brought up to worship in church have drifted away and it hard to say what actually encourages people back. Reflecting on my own past church experience, I can understand why attending church can put the hardiest soul off attending ever again.

Despite all this, I believe faith is not only relevant but critical to overcoming this world we inhabit, often just about self-gratification and 'me' needs. How can we become more

optimistic about life? Within this Berrow Benefice of churches, we have actively sought to bring people together, encouraging each other, trying to build and sustain a resilient and strong fellowship and with a deeper relationship with God. With mutual support, we can explore our own spiritual journey and share stories and the evidence of God's love for his people.

People nowadays are best at finding the fastest way to do everything. We seek instant success. People always try and find a short cut, and we lose patience for activities that won't provide instant gratification. However, when it comes to the church, patience, consistency and hard work are necessities.

There are absolutely no short cuts. On the contrary, it takes a long time to even understand what it takes to build this relationship with your church and God. It is for this reason among others that, to 21st century society, the church is not seen to be relevant. People no longer are familiar with the Bible and how to study it and the basis of what faith and discipleship entails. So there are serious implications when the priest is no longer resident or even familiar. But who and how can we still be present as the 'Body of Christ'? Our beautiful Grade 2+ listed church buildings are very much present. What ways do we endeavour to engage with our communities and how do we continue to be relevant, you ask?

The Church of the Redeemer, Pendock Cross, All Saints Hollybush and St John the Baptist, Eldersfield are open daily thanks to the automatic systems we have managed to put in place. To open our churches is to open them to anyone seeking that peace and prayerful sacred space. Pendock Old Church is open, a redundant church looked after by the Historic Churches Trust. Birtsmorton church is used regularly for weddings, but we are always ready to open the church for interested visitors. St Faith, Berrow seeks someone to open daily as the ancient door defeats most electrical mechanisms. We have a published rota of Sunday services that have a variety of formal and informal ways of worship e.g. Café Church and Walking Church.

Our young wedding couples and their families who do their 'qualifying connection' by attending Sunday church services for a minimum of 6 months, once a month, in order to marry in our lovely churches, comment frequently on the outstanding quality of the warm, friendly welcome they receive in our church services.

We have fewer Church Wardens, but many folk now see themselves as part of the 'Benefice Team'. We work together as a family. So what ever or wherever the church the service is, everyone takes a share in cleaning, polishing, setting up, serving refreshments, helping with the welcome at the door. The role of Church Warden goes back many centuries but fewer people step forward to take on this formal role. Churchwardens are responsible for the good working order of the church doing those things not done by the priest.

It is a challenging but rewarding unpaid role and it helps if they are blessed with patience, good humour and perseverance. Having a knowledgeable and capable Treasurer and PCC Secretary also helps the running of any parish. All are volunteers and dedicate a great deal of time and energy to their roles. With no particular 'role', many help out who are just willing to assist in the smooth running of the various services and activities centred around the Berrow Benefice.

Many people are lonely and rarely join in community events. Where do people gather? We no longer have a shop, so the only public places are the public houses: like The Butchers Arms, The Framers Arms and The Duke of York. We may meet folk taking their dogs for a walk. Most children at the local schools at Pendock and Eldersfield arrive by car and the families may not even live in the locality. However, contact for our schools is via Church Governors and our Benefice 'Open the Book ' team who regularly lead the Wednesday morning Bible story and worship in our local schools. The Tuesday morning 'Drop In' started in January at Pendock CE Primary School. It is through the various social events throughout the Benefice that bring us into contact with a wider range of folk. These events only happen due to the enthusiasm and commitment, through the sheer of hard work, organisation and the energy of the faithful few.

When genuine faith is backed by love, people can also come to believe that our lives are genuine, real, trustworthy and our actions say more than our words. Are we able to inspire others by what we do and say? This is our challenge amongst all the other issues and changes.



# Who was Bartholomew?


In the liturgical cycle, he is celebrated on August 24<sup>th</sup>. He was one of the 12 main disciples of Jesus Christ. His name *only* appears in the four lists of the twelve apostles. He's never given any distinguishing qualities or titles, so aside from his name, we know almost nothing about him. Known as "the apostles" or "ones who were sent,"

Bartholomew and the other disciples witnessed Jesus' ministry for about three years. After Jesus' death, they began the movement which became known as Christianity. This makes Bartholomew one of the important and authoritative leaders of the early church, and he likely helped spread the gospel to many regions during the first century—may be India-but he's never explicitly mentioned or singled out in any of the epistles. The earliest surviving writings about Bartholomew come from centuries after his death and are unreliable. There are various traditions about where he went, what he did, and how he died.

After Jesus died, was resurrected, and ascended to heaven, Bartholomew received the power of the Holy Spirit along with the other apostles (Acts 2:1). Most disciples went around in pairs. Philip and Bartholomew are listed together, and scholars believe this implies they travelled together. Like most of the apostles, Bartholomew was probably martyred—but there are several traditions about how exactly he died. He may have been flayed and then beheaded, or beaten unconscious and drowned.

We know more about James the Apostle, celebrated 25<sup>th</sup> July.



As many will have seen the boundary wall at Eldersfield Parish Church has suffered a major collapse and is in need of urgent repair and restoration. After extensive discussions with structural engineers, archaeologists etc. it seems that the reconstruction will be a major job with around 10m of wall to be replaced at a cost of over £10,000. When dealing with a historic building, classified as a Grade 2\* site, the work must be completed, overseen and approved by archaeologists and the Diocese of Worcester. We hope that the rebuilding work will begin very soon.

You can guess that this will require a lot a fundraising! Last year our wonderful team managed to raise over £5000, mainly for minor works in the church building, with the concert, auction, quiz nights etc: these funds will now, however, have to be diverted to the wall repair. Our major event this year is the Summer meal and entertainment at Eldersfield Court on 1<sup>st</sup> July and we hope that you will be able to support us in our major efforts to restore this remarkable and beautiful historic site.

## Recipe of the month – July/August

## "Raspberry Rhapsody"

This quick-to-assemble dessert can be made with raspberries or any other summer fruit or combination. It would make a very good follow on for a BBQ.

## Ingredients (for 4 - 6 people)

170 – 230 gm raspberries
500 gm double cream
500 gm Greek (or other creamy) yoghurt
A few crushed meringues
2+ tablespoons red fruit syrup (ice cream topping or sieved raspberry jam)
Vanilla essence (a few drops)
A little castor sugar (if needed)

4 sundae glasses or stubby tumblers – or a glass serving bowl.

## <u>Method</u>

Whip cream with vanilla (plus sugar if needed) to the consistency of the yoghurt, then combine gently with the yoghurt and pieces of crushed meringue. Layer into bowl; syrup, raspberries, cream mix, meringue pieces and repeat, ending with cream mx. Decorate with raspberries + any other suitable decoration, e.g. grated chocolate. Refrigerate until served. This is equally good with sliced strawberries.

### Weddings-Please check the website. www.berrowbenefice.org.uk

At present, we are holding a rotation of services each Sunday. Please check for details on the website or contact us. For the 'qualifying attendance' to be married in a church, you need to attend for a minimum of 6 months, once a month.

### How we get you legally wed

We are legally entitled to marry you in a Church of England church through the publication of banns, read 3 times before the wedding date. We ask you to contact your local parish church and arrange when the banns are to be read 3 times there too. A **Marriage Document** is now signed at the church ceremony since the rules changed on May 4<sup>th</sup> 2021 and then you apply for a Marriage Licence through the **Worcester Registry Office**. We will give you all the details.

### **Common License**

In very special cases, you can apply for a Common License to marry with us. Please do seek an early explanation and the process involved.

### **Civil Ceremony followed by a Blessing in Church**

If you are unable to attend for 6 months to qualify, then you could have Registrar a civil ceremony first. We can then offer you a Church blessing of your marriage which is as similar to a full wedding as we can make it.

### Conclusion

Rev'd Anthea and I are ready to help you during this decision making process. Please do discuss the options with us and your wedding venue hosts. We do try to meet your expectations and make this a special day. Do try and attend our marriage preparation day. We try to answer your questions, look at the wedding day itself and looking ahead to the future.

At the point you are baptized, you simply have water poured on your head. If you are considering being baptized or for a member of your family, do talk to us as we will be delighted to help. Baptism can occur during the usual church services which rotate around the Benefice or at a time for just you, your family and friends.

# **Funerals**

If you wish to have a church service, please contact the priest to check dates as soon as possible. With your chosen Funeral Director, all bookings and other arrangements can proceed for you, the family and with the help and support of the clergy during this difficult time. We are still requesting the wearing of face coverings inside the buildings.

If you wish to have a burial in the churchyards at St John's, Eldersfield. St Faith's, Berrow or All Saints, Hollybush, the deceased person must have been resident in that Parish. Reservations (which last for 25 years) can be made by applying for a faculty which is a formal legal process and which we can help guide you through.

The Diocese of Worcester has issued guidelines for the erection of memorials in the churchyard. Please contact a local Stonemason who will have these details.



Pastoral care is one aspect of a priest's role. The word *pastor* comes from the Latin word for "shepherd." Caring for a person who is struggling with a difficulty, being present during a time of pain, praying with someone in a crisis—these are the moments when we need to know someone can come alongside us from the church community.

Most people only visualise a priest working on a Sunday. The reality is that preparing for Sunday services, Bible Study, and daily prayers are only a small part of my role. Looking after several churches, being on many different committees including being a school governor for our two local schools, engaging in a large wedding ministry, plus occasional offices like funerals and baptisms, means that my working week is very busy.

The Pastoral Visitor is Mrs Cathy Powell-Chandler. Part of her role is to co-ordinate pastoral visitors within our church communities. If you would specifically like me to visit you, then please indicate this by contacting me direct or via one of the church officers, all details of which are in the magazine. In a caring community, we all look to see whether our neighbours need or wish to accept our help.


Refreshments with a Chat and catch-up
